Heathlands Court was also awarded 3rd place for their marrow

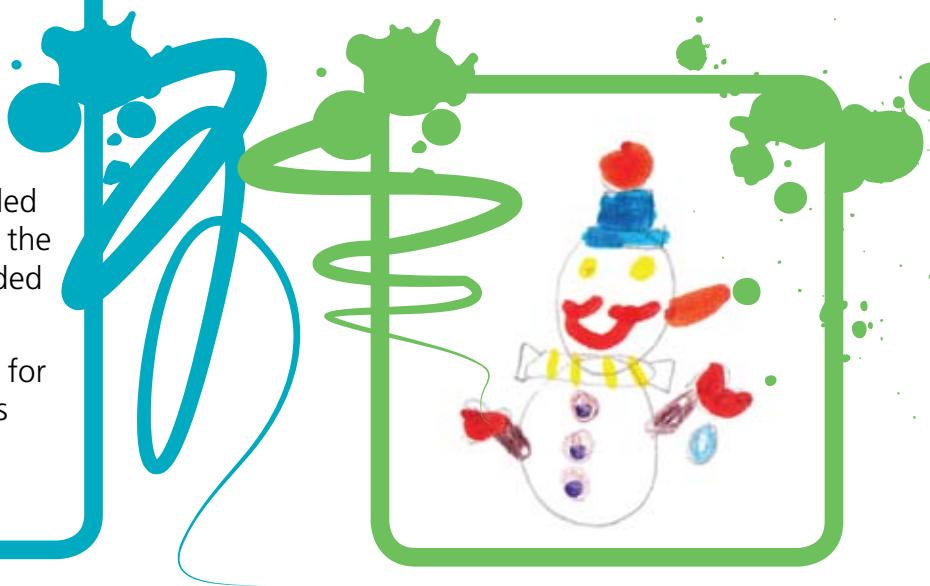
Dear Sentinel,
